NOV. 14, 2021 Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings are about the end times, which leads us to next Sunday's celebration of Christ as King of the Universe. Advent will begin looking towards Christ's coming, both at the end of times and the coming celebration of his birthday at Christmas. That cycle repeats itself each year using one of the three synoptic gospels for most of the gospel readings that year before beginning the three-year cycle over again. Cycle A uses the gospel of Matthew, Cycle B uses Mark, and Cycle C uses Luke. John's gospel is spread throughout the three cycles to fill in as needed.

Being a time of preparation, Advent has many traditions that may help us get ready for Christ's birth, such as the Advent Wreath, displaying an empty manger with or without a nativity set, a Jesse tree, St. Nicholas Day activities, lighting a Christ Candle and/or a Mary candle, making St. Lucy cakes, baking Christmas treats, blessing your Christmas tree, and other family traditions.

Because a question sometimes comes up whether an Advent wreath is appropriate since it is both a modern innovation and its origins are in the Lutheran Church, following are my comments on that beginning with a description: An Advent wreath consists of four candles placed around a circular wreath, lighting one candle the first week, two the second, etc. The circle of the wreath represents God's eternal existence, without beginning or end. Use of the Advent wreath is much more recent than the season of Advent, coming into common use only a few centuries ago.

The precursor to the Advent wreath were the wheel shaped bundles of evergreens on which

Germanic peoples placed candles, partially to keep warm in their cold climates, and partially as a pagan symbol. German Christians adopted the wreath with four candles in the 16th century to become what is now the Advent wreath.

While most researchers would probably confirm the Lutheran roots behind the origin of the Advent wreath, the Catholic church has incorporated many pagan traditions to use in (new) ways that symbolize our Catholic beliefs. The use of a Christmas tree goes back to the

Next Sunday is the Feast of Christ the King, the last Sunday of this liturgical year.

The new liturgical year begins on the Sunday following Thanksgiving, the First Sunday of Advent, on November 28th. symbolic use of evergreens in ancient Egypt and Rome. As for modern innovations, not very many years ago, the Roman Catholic church developed a whole new liturgical rite just to make Anglicans who wished to convert to Catholicism more comfortable. Many more examples are available.

My family used an Advent wreath every year while I lived at home. I have not heard whether it is common for families in our parishes to use an

Advent wreath at home during Advent, but I hope you do. There is no set way the Advent wreath must be used, but a common approach is, before saying grace at dinner (or any other meal), light the appropriate candle(s) (purple candle(s) during the first two weeks, pink or which the third week, and the last purple during the fourth week). Look for a special prayer or prayers that might assist you in preparing for Jesus' coming while lighting, or just after lighting the candle, followed by saying grace for the meal. It is very simple, and a great way to remember Jesus' coming.

Both parishes will celebrate with an Advent wreath during Advent.
