Retirement – Father Dave Petron

I have been asked numerous times over the past couple weeks about retiring. Am I retiring? When am I retiring? All along, I assumed everyone knew the process for retiring, but I was wrong. I will correct that today.

ACC's (Area Catholic Communities) are designed to work best with one pastor and one or more associate pastors to assist them. That may not be practical for ACC's with more than one large parish, but that is the plan for most ACC's, including ours. Fr. Matthew thanked me for staying on as pastor last summer because St. Mary's takes some getting used to. By Christmas, he told me he was prepared to take on the responsibilities of the pastor of our ACC if I wished to retire this year. At that time, I expressed my desire to the diocese to retire at the end of this term, but did not turn in my resignation letter.

Any priest can retire in the calendar year he has his 70th birthday. Except in an emergency, retirement takes place at the same time the new priest assignments take place each year, which is the first weekend after July 1. I turned 70 in May last year, but offered to stay if I remained pastor in my current assignment. My birthday was before July 1, so I knew I could retire. I learned only this year that a priest who turns 70 by December 31 of a given year can retire on July 1 of that same year. Those are the retirement guidelines.

To be able to retire, a priest must submit a letter of resignation to the diocese in the early months of the planned year of retirement, or the year before, so that the diocesan assignment board can plan for a replacement. I did not submit my letter of resignation until the last mask mandate was put into effect. That mandate was inappropriate and the point when I decided I was done. Unfortunately, though I had not made a firm decision up to then, waiting that long to submit my resignation letter likely caused some confusion within the diocese. Even



though I expressed my desire to retire before Christmas, the diocese assumes a priest is not retiring until the resignation letter is received. Some priests were told by the diocese that I was not retiring (no resignation letter was on file) while others who knew me assumed I was retiring, and rumors spread. I submitted my letter before the mask mandate was lifted.

The diocesan plan for our ACC is that two priests will be assigned here as long as two priests are available, but only one pastor once I retire. Fr. Matthew Kuhn will become the pastor of St. Mary's, Immaculate Conception and St. Nicholas on my retirement day. Any other priest assigned to our ACC will be an associate pastor (also known as parochial vicar). The pastor makes all the decisions. The associate pastor assists the pastor, but has no authority to make decisions unless the pastor gives it to him. The pastor must be present at ACC pastoral council meetings and finance council meetings. The associate pastor may attend, but is not required to attend except as requested by the pastor.

Though this could change before the new assignments are announced in June, Fr. Matthew and the new associate plan to live in the rectory in Osakis until a new rectory is built that is closer to the hospital. This could take about a year. This will be discussed at the next finance council meeting for each parish. The ACC Pastoral Council approved this plan last Tuesday.
