Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) – Father Dave Petron

Attendees of the Saturday Mass in Osakis last weekend participated in the reception of the newest adult member into our Catholic faith community. He was baptized in

the Lutheran faith as a baby and received Confirmation and First Communion at Mass on Saturday. He started the Catholic RCIA program about a year ago after my bulletin article explaining the process. Since he was baptized outside of the Catholic faith, he followed the process of a *candidate* entering the church through the RCIA program.

An un-baptized individual entering the RCIA program is called a *catechumen*. While I individualize RCIA training for anyone entering the Catholic church, a catechumen typically requires more instruction than a candidate. Both catechumens and candidates are given as much instruction and time as they need to feel comfortable in making the choice—and speaking their desire—to enter the Catholic church. No one is forced to commit until they are ready. A person is free to walk away from the training at any time if they choose not to enter.

The Easter Vigil is the proper time for catechumens to enter the Catholic church, though exceptions can be made with the bishop's approval. The Easter Vigil also includes rites for both catechumens and candidates who wish to enter the church by receiving Confirmation and/or First Communion (catechumens are baptized earlier in the ritual before receiving these two sacraments). After Mass last Saturday, I was asked why the candidate was not entering the church at the Easter Vigil. I'm sure others likely have the same question. Candidates may be accepted into the Catholic church through the Celebration of Reception outside of the Easter Vigil, which is actually the preferred method for baptized Christians (candidates). Last Saturday happened to be the Feast of St. Joseph, the saint this candidate chose for his Confirmation name, so it was most appropriate that we celebrated his entry into the church on this feast day.

Very soon we will be celebrating the baptism of two grade school children in Belle River. The bulletin article I wrote a year ago was actually about an adult who desired baptism but did not want to go through RCIA, which is the proper way for an adult to receive baptism. RCIA also has a ritual for baptizing children and young adults, but choosing whether to baptize them within or outside of RCIA can be a bit challenging. The RCIA program for children calls for the child to also receive their First Communion and Confirmation at the same time. This puts most of them out of step with classmates they will be receiving instruction with in RE or at a Catholic School. Since they will continue to be receiving instruction in their faith through an RE program, I will be baptizing these two young people soon in Belle River. They are also receiving instruction for First Communion, so the baptism will take place before First Communion at the end of April.

This might also interest you. I have three adults in Osakis who are receiving instruction for Confirmation that they skipped when they were younger. I have no explanation for this, but I must receive the bishop's permission to confirm anyone who has been baptized Catholic. I automatically have permission to confirm a candidate whenever they are ready to enter through RCIA, and the permission to confirm catechumens during the Easter Vigil, but I must ask the bishop to confirm a baptized Catholic himself, or get his permission to confirm that person if he is unable to do so.
